Article of the Month:

AKC Recent Rule & Regulation Changes

Changes to Rules Applying to Dog Shows

Chapter 3, Section 23 Effective: January 1, 2010
Winners of the Best of Breed and Best of Opposite Sex in each of the individual miscellaneous breeds will be awarded points towards the Certificate of Merit (CM) title based on the number of dogs defeated. Upon completion of the CM title a dog may continue to compete in the Miscellaneous class so long as they are of an eligible breed. The CM suffix title is an introductory title to AKC conformation events and will be superseded by the CH title when earned. Chapter 7, Section 13 Effective: July 1, 2009
If the entry under any judge exceeds the limits allowed, the Event Committee must select another judge(s) to whom sufficient breeds can be assigned without removing provisional breeds listed in the judge's contract without the judge's agreement. The removal of any breeds is to be discussed with the assigned judge. This rule change clarifies the limit of entries and eliminates longer days that can result from multiple entries of the same dog.

Chapter 11, Section 1 Effective: January 1, 2010
All dogs must be individually registered by the day of the event to be eligible to exhibit at an AKC event. No dog shall be exhibited in a licensed or member dog show, except for dogs entered in the Miscellaneous Class unless it is either individually registered in the AKC Stud Book, or individually registered with a foreign registry organization whose pedigrees are acceptable for AKC registration. Only

dogs that are individually registered with a foreign registry organization and whose registration with the AKC has been delayed will be eligible for an extension.

Chapter 11, Section 4 Effective: January 1, 2010
An AKC litter number will no longer be accepted on an entry form. In addition, a Purebred Alternative Listing (PAL) or Indefinite Listing Privilege (ILP) number will be acceptable for participation in appropriate classes.

Chapter 11, Section 6 Effective: January 1, 2009
Upon discovery by the owner/agent that a dog may be ineligible for the class in which it has been entered, said dog may be transferred to an eligible open class at a show prior to the judging of any regular conformation class within the sex of that breed or variety. This transfer must be made by the Superintendent or Show Secretary at least one half-hour prior to the scheduled start of any regular conformation judging within the sex of that breed or variety. When such a transfer is completed a [Change to Open Class form](#) needs to be completed which will be supplied by the Superintendent/Show Secretary.

Chapter 12, Section 4 Effective: January 1, 2010
Because an AKC litter number will no longer be accepted on entries, it will not be necessary to provide this information in the printed catalog.

Chapter 17, Section 2 Effective: July 1, 2009
All recording and event service fees will be submitted to AKC in accordance with the AKC Board Policy. This change is to permit monthly billing of AKC licensed superintendents. All event secretaries must submit fees, all judges' books, and a report of the show to the AKC office so as to reach the office within seven (7) days after the close of the show.

Changes to Match Regulations

Chapter 7, Section 1. Approval Effective: August 1, 2009
Clubs that plan to hold an "OC" match must submit a [OC Match Application](#) to the AKC Event Operations Department no later than 15 days prior to the event.

Changes in Board Policy

There were two modifications to Board Policy regarding show-approvals.

1. Clubs in isolated areas, with no AKC club within 75 miles (it was formerly 100 miles) may hold up to four shows in a calendar year.
2. Clubs may hold events up to 125 miles (formerly 100 miles) from its territory, but are subject to host club approval if within another club's territory.

Changes to Junior Showmanship Judging Guidelines

Section 8. Judge's Examination and Evaluation

Effective: April 13, 2009

The use of the examination table when appropriate and the ramp may be used at the discretion of the judge for the ramp breeds. This is to better serve the efforts that both the Junior present his or her dog in the proper manner for the breed being handled and that the judge be cognizant of the proper presentation for that breed.
