Foods That Can Be Toxic To Dogs

There might be a few foods that you may not heard of on the list that can be toxic to dogs:

Avocados	Onions
Garlic	Raisins, Grapes
Apple Seeds	Peach, Plum, Pear
	Pits
Apricot	Cooked Bones
Nutmeg	Any animal bones
Chocolate	Macadamia Nuts
Pennies before 1980	

While cooked bones are not “toxic” they can be very dangerous to give your dog. Care should be taken in selecting the type of bone to give your dog and when chewing a bone, dogs should always be supervised.
